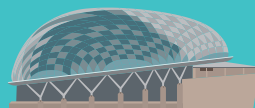

Back in the day, as thousands of bumboats bustled about the Singapore River lined with godowns, labourers toiled diligently while drenched in perspiration. Moved by these scenes, artists took to their brushes, crafting vivid masterpieces that brimmed with emotion.

Memories of Singapore River transports us back to simpler times through paintings and conversations with our veteran painters Lim Tze Peng, Tan Choh Tee, Low Puay Hua, as well as other Singaporeans who resided along the river.

Memories of Singapore River is a documentary film presented in Mandarin with English subtitles.

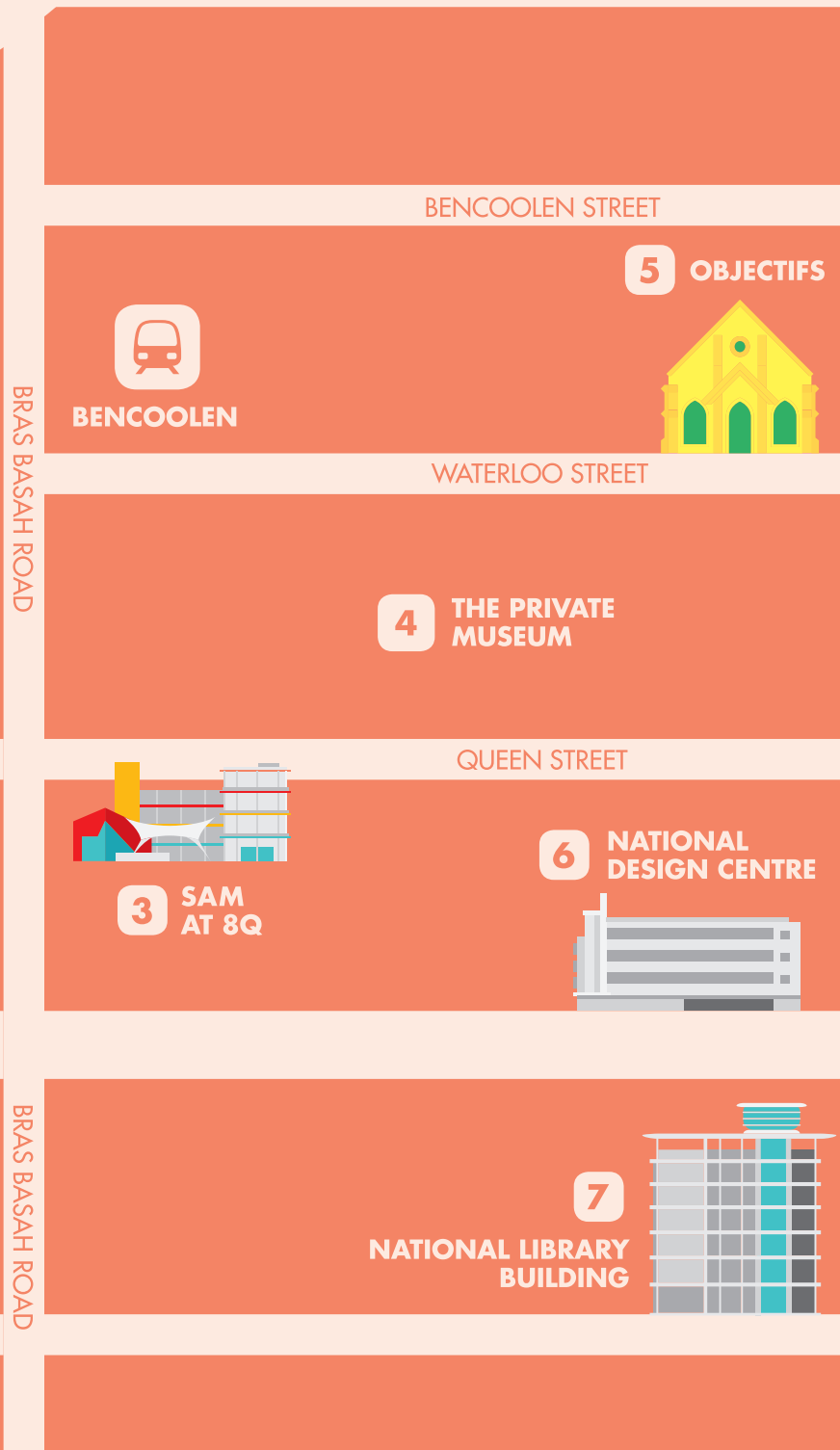

DANCE OF A HUMBLE ATHEIST

OBJECTIFS – CENTRE FOR PHOTOGRAPHY AND FILM

Objectifs presents the premiere of *Dance of a Humble Atheist*, a new work by Toh Hun Ping, one of Singapore's most innovative contemporary video artists known for his self-invented techniques of bleaching, scratching and recycling filmstrips that lead to his unique work.

Presented after a six-year hiatus, this multidisciplinary visual arts installation marks a new stage of Toh's artistic journey with the incorporation of ceramics into his practice. In a meticulous work created through the painstaking, frame by frame animation and digital manipulation of hundreds of his own handmade ceramic tiles, Toh expounds on death, faith, the possibility of the afterlife, the natural world, consciousness and time.

Dance of a Humble Atheist is complemented by a series of live performances, filmmaking and ceramics workshops, and talks on experimental cinema in Singapore.

Facing the imminent threat of en-bloc, coupled with dwindling sales and a notorious reputation with tourists, timber turned electronics hub Sim Lim Square is a melding of national and transnational labour and affects, visible and invisible networks, trendy and obsolete goods; all etched in the Singaporean subconscious.

Set against Singapore's rapid adoption of digital technologies, the 3-week residency held in the city's 'tech' mecca aims to code and re-code perspectives surrounding art, technology and space. Inhabiting a store unit repurposed as an artist studio, the residency offers opportunities to engage with communities and resources at Sim Lim Square to develop new works and artistic discourses. It aims to provide a space < > that serves as a conduit for ongoing conversations and investigations between the residency artists and diverse communities connected by the mall.

PROXY

Home(work) is a community-centric interactive installation looking at local issues of domesticity and labour through the mediums of mark-making, sculpture, and drawing. It poses to the public this question: how do we value different kinds of labour in society? At its core is the installation's interactivity. Everyday domestic objects are subverted and turned into art objects that participants can use to make marks. In doing so, the installation aims to encourage participants to contemplate their intersectional positions of house and art worker, and also gain a deeper awareness of the nature of labour used in the home.

Home(work) presents artworks and performances by artists of various backgrounds by interpreting their definitions of domesticity and labour, providing a personal translation on the issue. There will also be programmed workshops and on-going activities for the public.
