



**1. HOW THE NAC ARTIST-SPED SCHOOL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAMME WORKS**

- a. This programme is open to all SPED schools. Interested schools are assessed for eligibility based on the following criteria:
  - i. Readiness and willingness of school leaders and teachers to strengthen arts education programming
  - ii. Lack of in-house expertise and resources to further develop school’s existing arts education programme
  - iii. Clarity on how project fits into long-term plans to develop school’s arts education programme
  - iv. Potential to be a champion school for a specific disability group

**2. HOW THE SUSTAINABILITY OF PROJECTS IS ASSESSED**

- a. Inclusion of artist-led workshops to train their teachers
- b. Integration of art form into curriculum
- c. Development of customised modes of assessment to gauge student’s learning of the art form

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**3. FUNDING MODEL**

Funding in first year of programme	Funding in second year of programme
<b>90%</b> subsidy of instructor’s teaching and training fees or up to <b>\$10,000</b> per project, <u>whichever is lower</u>	<b>70%</b> subsidy of instructor’s teaching and training fees or up to <b>\$7,000</b> per project, <u>whichever is lower</u>
Total funding per school is capped at \$17,000, whichever is lower across two years with an artist and an art form.	

The grant will be disbursed in two tranches: (a) 80% at the point of the award and (b) 20% upon completion of the presentation, and the submission of the necessary budget and evaluation reports
