It features key milestones of the Cultural Medallion and related cultural development in the wider arts scene in Singapore, as well as photographs of all the Cultural Medallion recipients from the archive of National Arts Council (NAC), National Archives of Singapore and SPH Media. Visitors can also view, for the first time, a display of the Cultural Medallion coin, lapel-pin and certificate. **Digital Feature: Cultural Medallion Award Videos** Also available for the first time for public viewing, this rare series of short videos on the Cultural Medallion recipients was produced by NAC since 2004 for screening during the annual Cultural Medallion Award ceremony. Featuring over 40 recipients, the recordings offer a glimpse into the recipients' creative journey and belief and will be updated each year with videos of new Cultural Medallion recipients. **Library Section** A collaboration with the National Library Board, this section invites visitors to step into the creative world of the Cultural

Medallion recipients by bringing together a selection of over 200





publications written by or about the recipients. Visitors can browse through the publications at the showcase and borrow most of titles at the public library branches across Singapore for further reading.

This library section aligns with The Arts House's core role as a centre for literary arts.

• Digital Interactive Station

To introduce all Cultural Medallion recipients to the wider Singapore community, this interactive section offers broad information on all Cultural Medallion recipients through write ups and videos produced by NAC, images of selected artworks by Cultural Medallion artists in the collection of the National Gallery Singapore and Singapore Art Museum, as well as selected press reports about the Cultural Medallion Awards from the archive of SPH Media. In addition, there is access to links to online information on the Cultural Medallion recipients such as TributeSG by Esplanade – Theatre on the Bay, and the eresources of the National Library Board.

• Digital Interactive Quiz

This section offers a light-hearted approach to learn through play, i.e., through a short quiz about selected Cultural Medallion recipients.

• Check Out Kiosk and Photo Wall

At the end of their experience, visitors can scan their NFC token at the Check Out Kiosk for an 'Art-inerary' of Cultural Medallion related activities to explore next. Recommendation is based on their interactions at the showcase. Visitors can choose to return their NFC token or to keep it as a memento. There is also a Photo Wall featuring the Cultural Medallion for visitors to take a photograph with.
