Old Songs of Redhill Market (红山脚下的歌谣) by Toy Factory | 5 September 2020 (Saturday)

Amanda has a huge soft spot for seniors, and has initiated intergenerational literary and community arts projects for senior citizen communities like 10 x 10 (conducted in English) and 白马 非马 (conducted in Mandarin).

The Drum 鼓声 by Ler Jiyuan

The Drum follows the journey of Kang, a recently retired man in his 60s dealing with the sudden onset of a later-life crisis. The short film won the 2018 Viddsee Juree Gold Awards, and competed at the prestigious 2017 Clermont Ferrand Short Film Festival.

### About the Director:

Ler Jiyuan is a Singaporean director of several prominent TV dramas such as HBO Asia's Grisse, Mediacorp Studios Channel 5 telemovie Gone Case, and The Love Machine. He is also the showrunner for the critically-acclaimed HBO Asia series Invisible Stories, which premiered in Jan 2020.

**Rayqal** by Sufyan Sam'an 17 min | English and Malay with English subtitles

### About the Director:

Sufyan Sam'an has worked through the ranks since the age of 16 as a production assistant and was a freelance 1st assistant director for over 8 years. Several short films of his have won numerous awards such as The Red Packet that won Overall Best Film and Best Direction at the ciNE65 competition.
