

# DURING THE PROJECT

My indicators include :- • Participant behaviour (engagement/participation) • Verbal responses from participants • Written responses from participants
I have documented the progress of the project using various tools.


## CHECKLIST

# AFTER THE PROJECT

I have evaluated how my project was carried out.
Were the logistics for the project adequate?
Venue/Materials/Time, etc.?
Was I able to achieve my objectives?
Was I able to meet the objectives of my participants and stakeholders?
Was my project able to achieve its purpose?
What were the challenged and limitations of the project, and how were they dealt with?

I have evaluated the impact of my project.

Were there any changes in behaviours, attitudes, and perceptions of the participants?
Did the participants learn and/or discover anything new?
Is my project worth doing/not worth doing again?



### JUST A FEW TIPS ...

### HAVE THESE AT YOUR FINGERTIPS FOR A SOLID EVALUATION!

- I. OBJECTIVE- KEEP THEM SHORT AND SIMPLE, THEY ARE THE KEYSTONE TO YOUR EVALUATION.
- 2. How you planned your project can be evaluated as well it will help you improve for future projects.
- 3. A PICTURE PAINTS A THOUSAND WORDS, AND IT LASTS LONGER. NEVER FORGET TO DOCUMENT YOUR PROJECT.
- 4. Get a range of perspectives on the outcome of your project.
- 5. EVALUATION BENEFITS EVERYONE STAKEHOLDERS, PARTICIPANTS, AND YOU.
- 6. ALWAYS FIND THE TIME TO SLOW DOWN AND REFLECT ABOUT HOW YOUR PROJECT IT GOING.
- 7. THINK ABOUT HOW THE CONCERNS OF YOUR PARTICIPANTS AND STAKEHOLDERS CAN HELP TO ENHANCE YOUR PROJECT EVALUATION.
- 8. BE OPEN ABOUT THE OUTCOMES OF YOUR PROJECT WHEN REPORTING BACK ABOUT IT.
- 9. UNINTENDED OUTCOMES SOMETIMES YOUR PROJECT ACHIEVES MORE THAN YOU EXPECTED. IF IT DOES IT IS WORTH NOTING.
- 10. ETHICS BE AWARE OF THE VARIOUS LIMITATIONS THAT YOUR PARTICIPANT GROUP MAY ENTAIL (SUCH AS CONFIDENTIALITY, ANONYMITY, ETC.), AND HOW YOU CAN WORK YOUR DOCUMENTATION WITHIN THESE LIMITATIONS. IF YOU ARE UNSURE, ASKING FOR PERMISSION CAN HELP YOU DETERMINE THE LIMITATIONS YOU MAY HAVE TO WORK IN.
