ABOUT THE START FUND



The Sustain the Arts (stART) Fund is a joint initiative by the National Arts Council (NAC) and the private sector that aims to boost the long-term sustainability of small arts groups, and nurture a culture of giving towards the arts. While small arts groups bring diversity and vibrancy to the local arts scene, they may need

more help to build up their capabilities and establish robust governance structures, in order to ensure that they are better equipped to sustain their practice in the longer-term.

The importance of the stART Fund is especially significant as the COVID-19 pandemic has dealt a heavy financial blow to the local arts scene. Through supporting our local arts groups, the stART Fund will help to ensure that the arts live on to create and present quality programmes that contribute to the vibrancy of Singapore's arts and culture ecosystem.

START FUND'S OBJECTIVES

To fund programmes with community impact that enable more people to enjoy the arts, including digitally enhanced arts experiences, and programmes that encourage reflection of Singapore's cultural identity





ARTSWOK ATTAINING IPC STATUS After 6 years of attaining Charity status, ArtsWok was motivated to apply for the IPC status in recognition of the additional level of credibility the status would accord. 


